

Axel E. Hüttinger – Managing Director

The son of the previous owner of Hüttinger Interactive Exhibitions, from the age of 15, Axel worked on construction sites carrying out electrical installation work. After graduating from secondary school, he worked full-time for one year at trade fairs for the automobile industry worldwide. He was responsible for the handling and installation of highly complex functional exhibits for a long-term customer.



At the beginning of his university studies, he worked in the design department on interactive exhibits for several museum projects. Since spring 1998, he has worked for the company full-time. With his brother Jörg, Axel became Managing Director of Kurt Hüttinger GmbH in 2002, and managing partner in 2013, after Kurt Hüttinger transferred his company shares to his sons.

Benny Beringer – Project Manager, Exhibition Developer

Benny's experiences started on the design and production management of some complex exhibits for the Phæno Science Centre in Wolfsburg and the Mathematikum in Gießen. Since 2006, Benny has worked as Project Manager, steering some ambitious projects for the *Palais de la Découverte* in Paris, the Science Museum London, and the Copernicus Science Center in Warsaw, among others.



By combining beautiful and functional designs, he improves the quality of Hüttinger's exhibits from ideas to final products. His deep background of physical phenomena is very helpful for the development of interactive exhibitions for the general public, especially for the visitors of science centers.

Joe Cook – Exhibit Developer

Joe Cook has been testing and evaluating exhibits since childhood; this took him into the career of designing and building exhibits, ultimately landing him at The Mid-Hudson Children's Museum in New York, where his exhibits helped grow the attendance by 250%. He now brings the same enthusiasm for high impact exhibits to his work with Hüttinger as an Exhibit Developer.
